To create a laser file- Solidworks.

- 1. If one part, then skip to #3
- 2. Move your multiple parts to an assembly making sure all parts are on the same plane and there is a maximum gap of 1 mm and minimum gap of 0.5mm between parts.
- 3. Make a drawing from your assembly.
- 4. Use a custom sheet size, no larger than 608mm x 303mm.
- 5. Within the drawing file make sure your part is: 1:1 scale, Dimension type "True".
- 6. Turn off sketches (view- Sketches) and delete all center marks, labels etc. you don't want etched
- 7. Select one line then Ctrl A. This will select all lines. Right click over one of the lines and pick the paint brush Icon. Select the red (double check it is the correct colour by comparing the "Define Custom Color" RGB with the above chart)
- 8. Using Ctrl Left Click select lines that you need to change colours. (leaving inner holes/cuts red then next outer holes blue ..., ending with outside cuts.) Example if your drawing has a hole inside a second hole with an outside cut, the first hole should be red, second hole blue and outside cut Navy.
- 9. Tools Options Document Properties Line Thickness Thin = 0.05mm
- 10. Select one line then Ctrl A. Right Click on the line and pick Line Thickness and set to Thin (0.05mm)
- 11. File name convection: "NN M T GG"
 - a. NN number of times /quantity of file cut.
 - b. M material
 - c. T thickness of material
 - d. GG group designation ie MSE2202 group # or 1050 studio # team #

To create a laser file- OnShape.

- As of September 2017, OnShape doesn't allow you to change Drawing attributes, like line thickness and colour. So file needs outside program.
- 2. In OnShape, Right-click on the Drawing tab
- 3. Select Export, specify a name for the export file, select the DWG export format.
- 4. Select "Download" the export file.
- 5. Open Solidworks, then "File Open" as DWG, browse to your file Click "open"
- 6. Accept defaults in DXF/DWG import dialog box click "Next"
- 7. In DXF/DWG Import Drawing Layer Mapping: check "White Background" click "Next"
- 8. In DXF/DWG Import Document Settings: Data Units Millimeter, Paper Size A3-Landscape, Drawing Sheet Scale 1:1
- 9. Click "Finish"
- 10. Goto To create a laser file- Solidworks. Continue from step 6.
