## **Faculty Graduate Office Announcements:**

## :: Fall 2020 graduate courses

Online enrolment access for the fall term has closed. To withdraw from a course, please submit a "Request to Drop Graduate Course" form (found on your home department's website) to your graduate program coordinator. The last day to withdraw from a graduate course beginning in the fall term without academic penalty is October 30<sup>th</sup> 2020. Students who drop after this date will receive an **F** on their transcript.

## :: Academic Accommodation Policy (Graduate)

Students who are not able to meet certain academic responsibilities due to medical, compassionate or other legitimate reason(s), could request for academic consideration. The Graduate Academic Accommodation Policy and Procedure details are now available here.

## :: COVID-19 travel restrictions for international students

As of October 20, international students cannot travel to Canada from abroad unless their institution's COVID-19 readiness plan is approved by the provincial government. Western's plan has been submitted to the Government of Ontario. The Government of Ontario is reviewing institutional COVID-19 readiness plans in phases. We anticipate approval for Western's plan will be received in mid- to late-November. We will let you know once Western's plan is approved.

International students who are currently in Canada and choose to travel internationally will <u>not be able to return until Western's COVID-19 readiness plan is approved</u>. Western International has recommended that these international students do not make plans for international travel until Western's COVID-19 readiness plan is approved, unless they are intending to remain outside of Canada for an extended period of time.
