# :: "Birds, reflections and the hidden ecological cost of glass," Presented by Brendon Samuels, PhD Student, Department of Biology, The Advanced Facility for Avian Research, Western University December 15 @ 1:30pm via Zoom: <u>https://westernuniversity.zoom.us/j/7182941417</u>

People crave connection with nature, and the designs of many modern buildings cater to this need. Architects incorporate plate glass into buildings to provide access to light and nature from indoors, and to reflect nature outdoors. Tragically, plate glass also causes profound, violent harm to nature: each year hundreds of millions of birds die by colliding with glass windows on buildings. There are a variety of reasons why birds fly into windows – I will review some of them. Fortunately, economical solutions for preventing bird collisions exist that do not require drastic sacrifices in aesthetics. These solutions must be applied correctly and adopted widely in order to achieve bird conservation. Therefore, building designers and their clients must understand why bird-window collisions happen and what remedial actions are needed. I will discuss aspects of my doctoral research on bird-window collisions including behaviour of wild birds in urban environments, how I'm testing the role of avian vision in preventing collisions, as well as the human and industry dimensions of solving this global problem.
