Graduate Student Presentation Award

- Submission 15 minute (max) presentation recorded before a live technical audience, followed by a question-and-answer period. The video should be submitted in mp4 format and recordings must be viewable on a personal computer. The video submissions can be made via Dropbox or mailed in on a USB stick.
- Evaluation geotechnical content and interest (60%), oral and visual quality of presentation (30%), and performance during the question-and-answer period (10%).
- 1st Place Award \$1,250 honorarium and a certificate, one-year membership in CGS, free conference registration, and an opportunity to present at the Annual Conference (GeoCalgary 2020)
- 2nd Place Award \$750 honorarium and a certificate, one-year membership in CGS and free conference registration.

Undergraduate Report Award (Individual)

- Submission Written report (e.g., Undergraduate Thesis, Term Project, Summer Work Report, etc.) generated by a single undergraduate student. Submissions are accepted in electronic format.
- 1st Place Award \$1000 honorarium and a certificate, one-year membership in CGS, and free conference registration.
- 2nd Place Award \$750 honorarium and a certificate, one-year membership in CGS, and free conference registration.
- Maximum of one nomination per academic unit of each university (see the rules for definition of "academic unit").



Undergraduate Report Award (Group)

- Submission Based on a written report (e.g., Group Research Report, Term Project, etc.) generated by a group of undergraduate students. Submissions are accepted in electronic format.
- 1st Place Award \$700 per individual (up to a maximum of \$2,800) and certificates, oneyear membership in CGS, and free conference registration for each student.
- 2nd Place Award \$400 per individual (up to a maximum of \$1,600) and certificates, oneyear membership in CGS, and free conference registration for each student.
 - Maximum of one nomination per academic unit of each university
